by the Department of Education through the Emergency Works Scheme. Our yard space is now fully in use again and safe for the children to explore and play during break times.



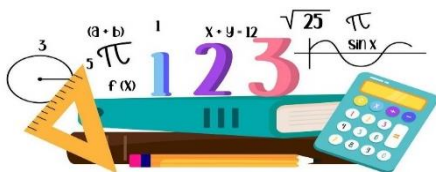
### NEW PRIMARY MATHS CURRICULUM
